Here's a taste of four events happening during the three-day event:

- An exhibition of sculpture and installation by Pat Schell opens at Salon Irène Grant-Guérette, Centre Samuel-de-Champlain, 67 Ragged Pt., Saint John on Friday at 7:30 p.m.
- Third Space Gallery in Saint John, with the Association Regionale de la Communité Francophone, welcomes Montreal-based performance artist Sophie Castonguay for an artist's talk on performative and movement based art from 2-3 p.m. at Saint John Free Public Library on Saturday, Oct. 1. Castonguay also presents an evening of two performance pieces that allowing anglophones and francophones alike to become collaborators in an artwork questioning public roles and behaviour at Le Faubourg, 125 Prince William St., on Thursday from 7-8 p.m.
- The Charlotte Street Arts Centre open house Sunday, Oct. 2: resident artists and businesses talk, demonstrate, offer free workshops, perform and/or display work. 12-4 p.m. 732 Charlotte St., Fredericton.
- Galerie d'art Louise et Reuben-Cohen in Moncton hosts an opening reception for its new exhibition 'À l'ombre d'Évangeline / In The Shadow of Evangeline,' a group exhibition featuring Maryse Arsenault, Jean-Denis Boudreau and Stefan St-Laurent, on Friday from 5-9 p.m.
